	<u>Chairman's Welcome and Public Forum</u> – members of the public may address the Council, prior to the commencement of the meeting. The Chair reminded attendees that as it was advertised as a public meeting it could be filmed or recorded by broadcasters, the media or members of the public.			
	Mrs G. Palmer – in respect of Planning Application PA18/00774, Plot adjacent to Allwynds, Lanteglos. Mrs. Palmers' son is the applicant. Mrs Palmer said there is a need for local housing but only a small amount of land available. She gave a brief family history and explanation that her son is looking to return to the parish he grew up in. Should her son gain permission for this building plot, this would be his only residence and would never be used for holiday letting.			
	Ms. J. Curtis – in respect of Bryn-Y-Mor, Chapel Lane, Polruan – alleged installation of a fuel pump in a conservation area. She had given permission for the box to be fixed to her boundary wall, but not the pipe. Her understanding was the pipe was to be installed in the highway and not along her wall. Currently in correspondence with Highways and Planning Enforcement regarding the issues with this installation but fears she may have to take a civil action against the installation.			
	Mr V. Trueman – requested that the February Minutes be updated to a 'word- by-word' account of what he said regarding the notice boards in Polruan as he felt they did not reflect his own personal recording. Cllr. Fisher pointed out that Minutes are not required to be a 'word by word' account of what is said and that Mr Trueman never made this kind of complaint when he was a Councillor.			
	He went on to request that Cllr. Moore apologise for the Code of Conduct complaint against Cllr. Adams and resign. The Chairman ruled him out of order having explained to him again how Councillors are elected, then Chairmen, and that he had no authority in this matter.			
	He also questioned if Cllr. Fisher should be the person taking the Minutes.			
	Cllr. Bunt – the gully / drain by Hall Walk Cottage had been replaced and securely fixed down. Residents had complained because previously it could be lifted to take water. The Clerk to check this with Highways / Cllr. Hannaford and enquire if it could be replaced with a 'liftable' grid.	Clerk

	Cllr. Adams requested further clarification regarding access to Brazen Island mentioned in the report from the meeting with the Harbourmaster. In Cllr. Moore's report it stated that future access would only be by water. However, it already has a public footpath to it. Cllr. Moore allowed Mr Hill to clarify there are no plans to create an access road and that all current access (footpath and water) remain.

		Although not a quorum, the Members present supported the application, as the site is naturally a building plot adjacent to the existing row of bungalows. A bungalow would be in keeping and the site has good access. Members also supported this as a principal residence.	Clerk
	ii.	PA18/01350, Jan Syvy, Old Road, Bodinnick – consent to fell 3 Leylandi, 1 Ash, 2 Cherry, 1 Oak clump and 1 Eucalyptus tree within Bodinnick Conservation area. Noted this type of application is dealt with under delegated authority by CC's case officer.	
	iii.	PA18/01033, Pendower House, Pont Bottom, Highway – conversion of existing outbuilding into self-contained residential unit. SUPPORT . Members did have concerns that the property will be used for holiday letting in the future, but it is understood that this would require a separate planning application.	Clerk
	iv.	PA18/01495, Midships, 2 New Quay Terrace, East Street, Polruan – installation of first floor balcony to front elevation of dwelling. OBJECT to this application. Members felt the balcony was not in keeping and would be be very prominent over the footpath. In turn, this would also cause an overlooking issue. Members did not have an issue with the full height window and a 'Juliet Balcony' may be more appropriate.	Clerk

PA18/01629, Springhill, Chapel Lane, Polruan – works to trees in a conservation area, namely crown reduction of mature ash, reshape two mature oaks, crown reduce semi-mature cherry, crown raise semi-mature beech avenue, reduce by 40% small beech hedge and remove dead poplar. Noted this type of application is dealt with under delegated authority by CC's case officer.

	i.	<u>EN17/00177, 4 Bones Meadow, Greenbank, Polruan</u> – alleged construction of gabion basket design wall not being built in accordance with approved plans PA15/09540; namely safety concerns associated with the wall which is leaning out over the public footway and also the path which has not been surfaced. Case officer, Felicity Copplestone.	
	ii.	Bryn Y Mor, Chapel Lane, Polruan – alleged installation of a fuel pump in a conservation area. Case officer: Ms Felicity Copplestone had advised the planning enforcement investigation is continuing and she had been compiling the information provided to her by the owner of the pipeline and consulting various other departments in order to fully assess the situation.	
		It appears that the Section 50 Streetworks Notice for putting the pipe underground was appropriately applied for. However, the Section 50 only covers apparatus which goes underground and in the highway. Apparatus above ground along the highway goes to the Highways Department to assess, which did not happen prior to the pipeline being installed.	
		The Highways and Environment section have some concerns regarding pollution risk and fire risk but do not consider that the pipeline poses an issue with the use of the public highway.	
		CC's Building Regulations department had been consulted in respect of the pipeline and considers that it does not fall within Part J of the Building Regulations, as such it cannot be controlled via those regulations.	

	The Neighbourhoods and Public Protection Team had also been consulted and had advised that should a spill or leak happen from the oil pipeline then they could deal with the remedial works but that the oil pipeline cannot be controlled via their legislation.	
	She will consider all aspects, assessing the impact of the pipeline and box on the character of the area and determining an appropriate course of action in respect of planning legislation in due course.
