Relevant geotechnical experts had been in contact with CC's structural engineer and they are working to get the appropriate information together for assessment. They are hopeful to get a multi-agency meeting with the owners/agents and any relevant experts from their side, in a couple of weeks' time. ii. EN17/02173, Bryn-Y-Mor, Chapel Lane, Polruan – installation of a fuel pump in a conservation area. Case officer, Felicity Copplestone advised they had concluded their assessment and have advised the owner of the oil pipeline that it is considered the works consisting of the installation of a cabinet and oil pipe line attached to the wall at Chapel Lane, constitutes development for which no planning permission had been applied for. It is considered that due to the adverse impact caused to the character and appearance of the Conservation Area of the cabinet and pipeline that it would be unlikely for planning permission to be approved should any retrospective planning application to retain the works be made. The owner has been invited to arrange to have the cabinet and pipeline removed from Chapel Lane within a period of 21 days from the date of this correspondence. She is currently awaiting contact from the owner confirming their intentions in respect of this matter and a subsequent timescale for compliance. Failure to comply with this informal request will result in the issue and service of a Planning Enforcement Notice to seek the removal of the cabinet and pipeline. i.
