Highway Matters -

- a. Road Signage Members to consider the responses from Mr Paul Allen, Highways i.r.o.
 - i. Church Lane Turning currently lying on top of the hedge. Mr Allen advised the sign was found to be fine and not leaning. He thought someone must have straightened it up.
 - ii. Bodinnick the metal road sign as you approach the turns for Trethake and St Veep from the direction of Bodinnick is wrong. It suggests the St Veep turn is before Trethake. Mr Allen noted this but said that as it had been like this for many years without any issues, the sign will be added to their replacement list but with a low priority.
- b. Other Highway Issues there had been response from Highways i.r.o.:
 - Poltec Lane Members to consider a proposal to clear the overgrown vegetation. It was clarified Poltec Lane is behind the council houses at Whitecross. Mr Allen advised the grass in centre of the road is not causing any safety issues.

- ii. <u>Highway Hill</u> January Public Forum refers. Highways had been asked when repairs to the road would be undertaken, given that green paint had sprayed some time ago. Mr Allen explained the potholes on this road had now been completed.
 - The hedges at the top of Highway Hill that are a traffic hazard and the brambles, above Lawhippett, had also been reported. Mr Allen will write to the landowners if Members can provide the contact details.
- iii. Road from Little Churchtown Farm to Pont Hill, Ref. W1918673 subsidence of the road. A photograph and map had been provided to Highways, who advised they had inspected the issue and we had determined that in accordance with our Highway Maintenance Manual it is not an immediate safety hazard. They will continue to monitor. Members consider this to be urgent. Mr Allen reported this road is on their list for repairs in the new financial year, in the meantime it will be monitored.
- iv. <u>Essa</u> there is signage directing traffic coming up from Pont, but nothing for traffic travelling from Polruan / Polperro. Mr Allen indicated additional direction signs are not considered necessary, however, if the PC wish to erect a new timber post and timber signs then he has no objections but asks to see the proposed location and wording before getting the signs manufactured.
- v. <u>Layby at Saffron Cottage, Pont</u> layby is subsiding. Cllr. Fisher had reported this online.
- vi. <u>Furzeball Lane</u> following damage to a private driveway, the Police had suggested a new prohibitive sign should be placed at

	the top of Furzeball Lane, at the junction by Trevedda, with a 'max width' shown on it and saying no entry to HGVs. Mr Allen's response was that the Council's highway revenue funding does not allow for such new signs. Such signs would either have to be requested as a bid through the Community Network Panel funding process or be funded from a third party.	
	c. Greenbank Fence – Highways' Works Programming Team confirm that Greenbank Polruan is on the programme to start at the end of February / early March, however this could be subject to change due to emergencies or weather conditions. The Clerk had sent a reminder.
