Some of these would be close to neighbouring properties and there are fears that it was intended as a commercial parking venture. The owner already has a significant amount of vehicular parking in two areas, both behind and below the property at Hockens Lane, and therefore, the proposal to vastly increase the size of the raised parking platform is very concerning.
